WE MAY ADD THAT THE STRUGGLE BETWEEN OPPOSITES PERMEATES A PROCESS FROM BEGINNING TO END AND MAKES ONE PROCESS TRANSFORM ITSELF INTO ANOTHER, THAT IT IS UBIQUITOUS, AND THAT STRUGGLE IS THEREFORE UNCONDITIONAL AND ABSOLUTE. --MAO
